Our new Parish Partnership known as St Colmcille Partnership of Parishes is our response to the Building Hope Project initiated by Archbishop Dermot Farrell. We are getting to know our neighbouring parishes and, with co-operation and regular contact, we will be able to meet the future challenges while maintaining the individual identities and churches we know and cherish.

It is very clear that the future will not look like the past. Our world has changed: God is bringing forth something new among the precious treasure (Matthew 13:52 — bringing out of the storeroom new treasures as well as old). Year of St Joseph
Pope Francis on Tuesday announced a
special year dedicated to St. Joseph starting from
8 December 2020 until 8 December 2021, on the
occasion of the 150th anniversary of the
proclamation of St. Joseph as the Patron of the

Universal Church, as well as the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of Our Lady. The Apostolic Penitentiary also issued a decree granting special indulgences for the duration of the special year to celebrate the anniversary and "to perpetuate the entrustment of the whole Church to the powerful patronage of the Custodian of Jesus."

During this period, we will have the opportunity to commit ourselves

"with prayer and good works, to obtain, with the help of St. Joseph, head

of the heavenly Family of Nazareth, comfort and relief from the serious

human and social tribulations that besiege the contemporary world
