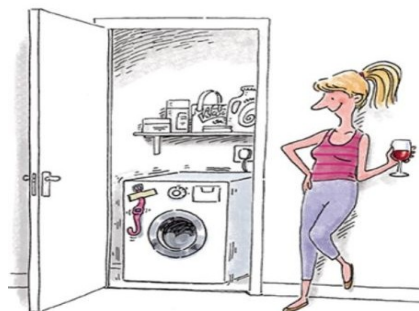

Figuring things out

“Whatever you say, say nothing” was a piece of wisdom the Irish poet Seamus Heaney learned from his mother. But that advice doesn't make for writing poetry and the son had to shelve its claim on him. Heaney has reflected on his relationship with his father, a farmer close to the land, a quiet man who had reason to believe that language was a kind of betrayal. In his writing Heaney tries to figure out his father whose inwardness and reserve are a constant challenge to a son who wants to fathom him and get close to him. As he writes in his poem, *Follower*:

I wanted to grow up and plough,
To close one eye, stiffen my arm.
All I ever did was follow
In his broad shadow round the farm.

I was a nuisance, tripping, falling,
Yapping always. But I today
It is my father who keeps stumbling
Behind me, and will not go away.



The son starts out trying to follow in his father's footsteps but he discovers later that their skills are different: the son's new produce is poems not potatoes. There doesn't appear to be much common ground there; but even though their skills divide them, their roots keep them attached. Perhaps it is true to say that no matter how close people may be, everyone still has a lot of figuring out to do!

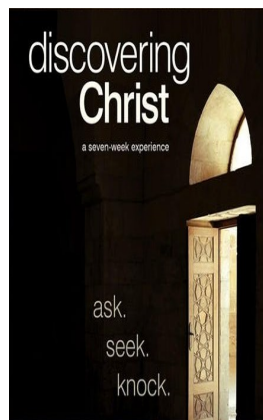
