God's Call

Great events often begin very simply. This was how Jesus began his mission. He looked for a little band of kindred souls, and demanded total commitment from them. And got it.

God calls us too, in many ways and at many different levels. He called us into life. Throughout our lives God continues to call us to a life worthy of our dignity as his children. At death God will call us from this life into eternal life.

God's call can take many forms, and be fulfilled in different ways. It is not likely to be as dramatic as was the call of Samuel, or as 'real' as that of the first apostles. Yet God speaks to us in the depths of our heart, calling us to intimacy with himself, and to be his co-workers in the world. Rather than a voice, his call is more a tug at our hearts, which we feel at quiet and reflective moments in our lives. Sometimes this may make itself felt in a very forceful way. But most times it is likely to be as gentle as a breeze.

The call of Samuel and the call of the first disciples are both relevant for our lives. Just as Samuel was called by God to the task of being a prophet, so each of us is called to do some specific work for God in the world. And the call of the disciples applies to us too, because at our baptism we were called to discipleship.

Every vocation is worthy of honour.
And every vocation is a call to the fullness of love.

Sixth Sorrow: The Return from Egypt

"But hearing that Archelaus was reigning in Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there; and being warned in a dream, he withdrew into the region of Galilee." (Matt. 2:22)

Sixth Joy: Life with Jesus and Mary at Nazareth

"And when they had fulfilled all things prescribed in the Law of the Lord, they returned into Galilee, into their own town of Nazareth." (Luke 2:39)
