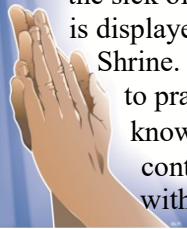

PRAYER FOR THE SICK

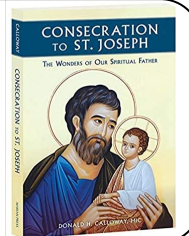

The importance of the small gesture

The leper's worst suffering was not the leprosy itself, but the pain of being rejected by everyone. In touching him Jesus gave him a sign of welcome, and repaired his sense of being dirty and unworthy, of being nothing but human scrap.

Jesus had this great understanding of, and feeling for, people who were suffering. Oscar Wilde put it like this:

Jesus understood the leprosy of the leper, the darkness of the blind, the fierce misery of those who live for pleasure the strange poverty of the rich, the thirst that can lead people to drink from muddy waters.

Jesus stretches our capacity for compassion. He challenges our idea of love. Each of us has a great capacity for love. The pity is that it often goes unused. We have it in our power to reach out to those who are suffering the pain and rejection. We could rekindle hope, bring back the zest for living, in someone else, and thus mirror dimly the infinite compassion of God.

By looking at Jesus we see how a Christian community should deal with sinners and people society rejects. Who are the lepers of our day? We know how Jesus would have treated them. How do we treat them? And on a personal level, each of us has been 'cleansed' by Christ in baptism, and ought to spread the 'good news'.
